CHRONIC/CARCINOGENICITY: The liver and kidney are target organs in high dose animal experiments. Fluopicolide Technical did not cause cancer in rats, but produced benign liver tumors in mice at the maximum tolerated dose. The mechanism of liver tumor formation in the mouse is believed to be not relevant to humans.

**DEVELOPMENTAL TOXICITY:** Fluopicolide Technical did not cause any teratogenic effects in animal experiments. Ingestion of excessive amounts by pregnant animals resulted in maternal and fetal toxicity.

**REPRODUCTION:** No indications of reprotoxic effects were observed in reproduction studies in animals.

**MUTAGENICITY:** Fluopicolide Technical is not genotoxic.
